Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I write you today to consider the importance of Catholic education in our homes, in our parishes, and in our Catholic schools. Forming our children and ourselves in the faith can never be put on "auto pilot" as if it will work out fine if we do nothing. On the contrary, being educated in the Catholic faith requires commitment, sacrifice and resources. And yet the rewards are so great-communication with Christ in the sacraments, a community of fellow believers, clarity about moral choices, and the hope of eternal life with the Trinity and all the saints!

Imagine the liturgical ceremony for the baptism of an infant. When newly baptized children receive the lit candle symbolizing the light of Christ, the minister proclaims that they "have been enlightened by Christ. . .May they keep the flame of faith alive in their hearts." As your Bishop, I am convinced that one of the most important ways we keep the flame of faith alive is through our parish religious education programs, adult faith formation, and Catholic schools.

With that in mind, I ask you to be generous to the annual **Catholic Education Collection** on the weekend of September 11-12. Half of the funds collected will remain at St. Paul's for educational initiatives. The other half will be forwarded to the Diocese to replenish funds in our two education endowments, and to support the Catholic University of America.

May the Lord bless you and your families for your fidelity and generosity.
